Work Experience Summer 2017

During the summer holidays Elle and I did work experience with Stagecoach theatre school in Maidenhead. We assisted in the running of their summer school which was 5 days and took place at Altwood School for four of them and was at Norden Farm on the last day for their performances.

On the first day, after meeting Fay (the principle) and the other teachers, we stood at the gates welcoming all the kids and their parents with a big smile. Our main job during the week was with Early Years which are children aged 4-6. They were in only in the morning and were learning an adaptation of School of Rock titled 'Rock School'. Our job was to assist with the teaching of them, running their rehearsals, assisting with their general wellbeing.

I also had the job on the performance day of doing the music which meant I was up in the sound-box which was a really cool and different experience, As a dancer, I am usually on stage, so working with this crew gave me a new perspective on the stage.

Once the Early Years were picked up at mid-day we had a well-deserved break and then supervised the lunch break of Main School .After their lunch we would clean up the hall and then take teas around to all the teachers. While Main School were in their afternoon session we did various tasks such as costume fitting/sorting, getting props, cleaning Early Year's rooms and writing out lyrics. On the performance day we helped to get the Early Year's ready in their costumes and then helped them rehearse. They looked so cute in their uniforms! For the Main School we chaperoned in the wings ,making sure that no-one was talking and that everyone knew when they were going on. At the end of it we made sure that we had collected up all props and costumes and packed them into Fay's (the principle) car which was the ultimate task of Tetris! Overall I massively enjoyed my week with Stagecoach and would happily do it again. It helped me understand the work behind running a stage school which will help me in my future as I want to one day have my own dance company and/or school. Furthermore it was really rewarding as when I got to sit up in the sound-box on performance day and watch the Early Year's performance I was so proud to see what they had achieved in 5 days and I also know that I made a couple of small friends by the end.

If you ever get the opportunity to do work experience I would definitely recommend it. It is really rewarding to look back and see what you've achieved and it gives you an idea of what your life may be like if you go into that area of work, helping to decide if it is what you want to do.

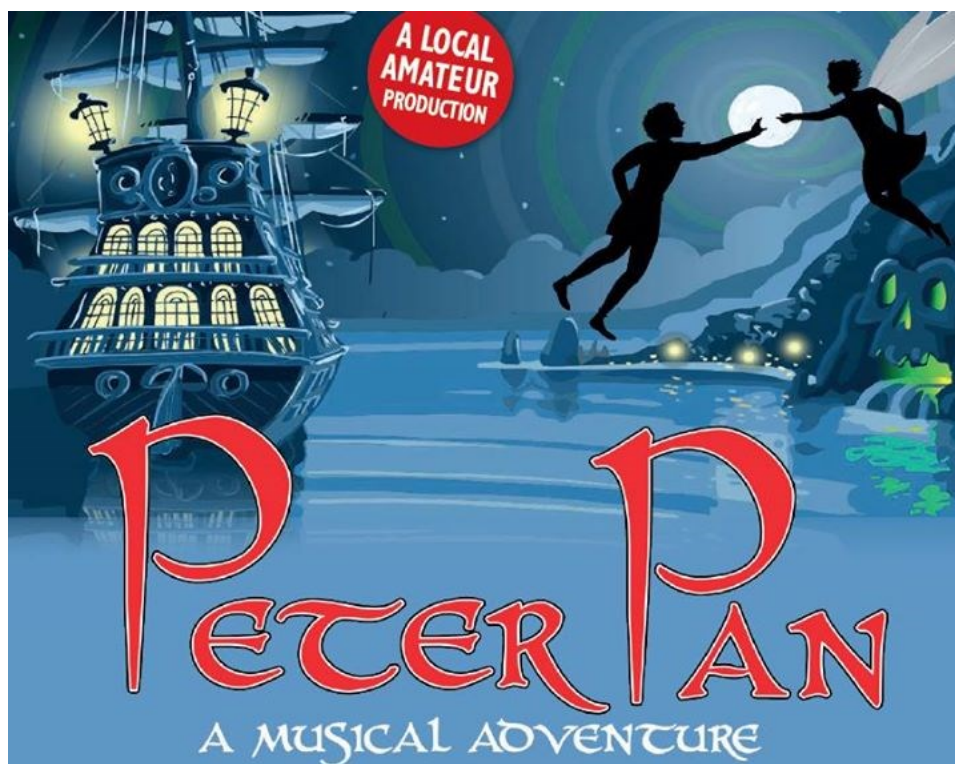
